How to Use This Book

The purpose of this book is to reveal more of how God sees you so you can learn to view yourself in the same ways. It is not meant to be me sharing my wisdom. It is designed to help you dig deeper to discover more for yourself and grow in your relationship with God.

Each day has one or more Scriptures, questions to ponder and a short prayer related to the truth about how God sees you. You can use these as a springboard to a deeper study and prayer time. I encourage you to keep a separate journal to note what God reveals to you. Or use the accompanying journal, *The Surprising Joy Journal II: A Daily Adventure with Your Identity in Christ.*

I challenge you to take time not only to read the devotional for each day but to meditate throughout the day on how God sees you. Ask God to transform your view of yourself, so you can begin to see yourself as He sees you and begin to live with confidence, knowing who you are in Him.

Some themes are repeated throughout the book, such as God's love for us. They are similar, but each one is different. I have repeated them, because they are critical truths for us to understand, so we can become all God wants us to be.

If you are starting this book later in the year, I'd encourage you to begin at the beginning and do the first twenty to thirty days. They lay a foundation for everything else.

Meditation

Meditation has gotten a bad reputation with Christians, because of the way other religions use it. However, the Bible has a lot to say about meditation. Look up the following verses. Think about what each one says about meditating on God and His Word:

- Joshua 1:8
- Psalm 1:1-2
- Psalm 48:9
- Psalm 77:12
- Psalm 119:27
- Psalm 119:97, 99
- Psalm 145:5
- Philippians 4:8-this uses the words "think about"

Other synonyms for meditate include: consider, think about, study, contemplate, ponder, deliberate and mull over.

I encourage you to take the time to meditate on and consider the truths from each devotional. Ask the Lord to reveal His truth to you as you meditate on His Word.

Further Study

You might want to take one verse or question from one of the devotionals to meditate on throughout the week, so you can go deeper in your understanding of who you are in Christ.

Whatever the topic is for the day, you can go deeper in your study by discovering what else the Word says on the topic. One way to do that is to go to www.BibleGateway.com. Put the word or words into the "Keyword Search Tool." For example, if the truth for the day is "I Am a Child of God," you could search for "Child of God."

Read through each Scripture, meditating on what they say. You can write some of them either in your journal or on the appropriate page in the book. Note: you can look in several Bible translations at once in BibleGateway.com.

Declarations

Throughout this book, I give you declarations to speak. Part of changing the way we think and view ourselves is speaking the truth out loud. Sometimes it isn't enough to just think the right truths. There is something powerful about speaking the truth from God's Word out loud.

In Romans 4:17 (NIV) Paul said about Abraham, "He is our father in the sight of God, in whom he believed—the God who gives life to the dead and *calls into being things that were not* [emphasis added]." Just as God calls things into being, we can do the same with our declarations. Our words are powerful. For example, if I am saying to myself (or if you are), "I'm tired," "I'm dumb," or "I'm a procrastinator," then we are calling in what will happen. We will become more of whatever we say about ourselves.

In the last two or three years, I've been speaking declarations almost every morning, aloud so I hear them, but the enemy also hears them. I declare who God is, who I am in Him and what He has done for me. It changes my outlook on life.

I encourage you to say the title for each day audibly, as a declaration. For truths that are harder for you to accept, you might want to put them on cards or sticky notes and repeat them every day. You may need to reprogram your mind to accept what God says about you, rather than what your earthly family, the enemy, "friends" or the media has told you.

Conditions that Must Be Met for Some of the Truths

Many of the truths in this book have conditions that must be met for them to be true for us. Some are written in the verses, others are not. Many of the truths are only true for those who have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. If you don't yet know Jesus, I encourage you to get to know Him.

This book reveals what a true relationship with God can bring. I don't want you to miss anything God has for you. If you want to know more, go to the back of this book, "Discovering a Personal Relationship with God."

Scripture Memory

I will often encourage you to memorize Bible verses. When you have the Word in your heart, you'll be amazed at the times God brings it back to you—just when you need it. I've been memorizing Scripture since I was a child. Often during the night, when I can't go to sleep, I'll begin meditating on a verse. For help on memorizing verses, go to my blog www.DailyNameofGod.com.

You Can Use This Book In The Following Ways:

• In your personal time with God, drawing you into deeper intimacy with Him

- As a couples' devotional, growing in your relationship with each other and God
- With your children, helping them gain a bigger view of God
- In a small group or with one or two friends, sharing your insights together
- With your whole church or ministry. Every household in one church got a copy of the first book in this series. They were able to share with each other on deeper levels at church, rather than talking about surface issues.
- If you are studying the book with others, look at the "Leaders' Guide" in the back of this book for some helpful ideas.

Hebrew and Greek Words

Some words from the original languages are included because often they add so much depth to the meaning. A word in Hebrew or Greek can have numerous meanings, yet they are translated with one English word. As a result, we miss so much of the meaning. Here are two of my favorite examples that we'll look at more in the future:

- Shalom in Hebrew is normally translated as "peace" in English. However, it also means the following: safe, well, happy, friendly, health, prosperity, favor, rest, welfare, friendship and more.
- Sozo in Greek is usually translated "save" as in "Jesus saves." However it also means so much more, including: deliver, protect (literally or figuratively), heal, preserve, make whole and do well. Think about all Jesus did for you, all that is included in the one English word "save."

The Hebrew and Greek words are written with easy-to-pronounce spellings, although there are other ways to spell them. Many times we will only look at the definitions and not include the word in the original language.

January 1 I Am the Light of the World

You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Matthew 5:14 ESV

Steps on Your Journey to Discover How God Sees You:

- Imagine you are a lighthouse sitting on a hill, allowing God's light to shine out of you. My prayer for you is that as you learn to see yourself more and more as God sees you, your light will shine brighter and brighter to everyone you encounter.
- What does it mean that you are the light of the world?
- In what ways are you a light to those around you? How can you be a better light?
- Jesus said in John 8:12 (ESV), "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life."
- How was Jesus the light of the world? How can you imitate Him? What might need to change in your life so you can be a light to those around you?
- What do the following verses add?

Philippians 2:15 (ESV): "Be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and twisted generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world."

Isaiah 60:1-3 (NLT): "Let your light shine for all to see. For the glory of the Lord rises to shine on you. Darkness as black as night covers all the nations of the earth, but the glory of the Lord rises and appears over you. All nations will come to your light; mighty kings will come to see your radiance."

- Who needs you to be a light for them? How can you do that?
- I encourage you to write Matthew 5:14 on a card or sticky note. Say it every day until you memorize it. For ideas on how to memorize Scripture, go to www.RRbooks.com.

A Prayer for You:

Jesus, thank You for coming as the Light of the world and that You are an example to me of how to be a light to those around me. Show me more how to bring light into this dark world. Forgive me for the times when I have blended in to the darkness rather than being a light.

January 2 God Adopted Me as His Very Own Child

When the right time came, God sent his Son, born of a woman, subject to the law. God sent him to buy freedom for us who were slaves to the law, so that he could adopt us as his very own children. Galatians 4:4–5 NLT

Steps on Your Journey to Discover How God Sees You:

- Romans 8:15 (ESV) says, "You did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, 'Abba! Father!"
- When you were still a sinner, an enemy of God, He sent His only Son to pay for your penalty so that He could adopt you as His very own child. Think about these questions: How much did it cost Jesus for you to be able to be God's child? How much did it cost the Father to watch His Son go through all the pain for you? What was the result of Jesus' work for you? What did God get out of it? He got us as his children, who would often cause Him pain because of our choices.
- At a concert recently, Steven Curtis Chapman shared how, when he adopted his children, his view of God's love for us totally changed. He saw in new ways how much it cost God to adopt us. The choice to adopt us as His children came at a very high cost to the Father—watching His precious Son endure betrayal, mocking, hatred, death and more. Father God had to turn His back on His Son when Jesus took all our sins on Himself. Do you understand what God did for you in adopting you as His child? How has that changed your life?
- What difference has it made in your life that you went from being a slave to being a son? Ask God to show you what it really means to be adopted as His child. Ask Him to show you any ways you are still living with a slave mentality, rather than a son or daughter mentality.
- You are now a prince or princess because the King of kings has adopted you as His very own child. Meditate on this today and in the coming days. If you would like to learn more about what it means to meditate on Scripture, go to the introduction of this book.

A Prayer for You:

Dear Lord God, thank You for being willing to send Your own Son to pay my price to take me from slavery to sonship. Teach me more of what this means and how it should affect my life. I give You permission to change my mentality so I see myself as Your child.

January 3 I Have Been Made Right with God

We are made right with God by placing our faith in Jesus Christ. And this is true for everyone who believes, no matter who we are. Romans 3:22 NLT

Steps on Your Journey to Discover How God Sees You:

- *The Message* paraphrases verse 24: "Out of sheer generosity he put us in right standing with himself. A pure gift. He got us out of the mess we're in and restored us to where he always wanted us to be. And he did it by means of Jesus Christ."
- What a gift God has given us! Think about it.
- What do the following verses say about those who are made right with God, the righteous?

James 5:16 (NIV): "Confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective."

Romans 4:4–5 (MSG): "If you're a hard worker and do a good job, you deserve your pay; we don't call your wages a gift. But if you see that the job is too big for you, that it's something only God can do, and you trust him to do it—you could never do it for yourself no matter how hard and long you worked—well, that trusting-him-to-do-it is what gets you set right with God, by God. Sheer gift."

Romans 5:1 (NLT): "Since we have been made right in God's sight by faith, we have peace with God because of what Jesus Christ our Lord has done for us."

- Think about this. God made you right with Him. All you had to do was put your faith in Jesus Christ. Have you done that? If not, what is holding you back? God longs for you to have a relationship with Him. If you are not sure, go to the back of this book to learn more.
- Do you see yourself as one who has been made right with God? Why or why not?

A Prayer for You:

Dear God, thank You for making me right with You when I placed my faith in You. Thank You that You said "the prayer of the righteous person is powerful and effective." Since I am righteous, because I trust in Jesus, I'm believing that my prayers are powerful and effective.

January 4 God Has Lavished Me with His Great Love

See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! 1 John 3:1 NIV

Steps on Your Journey to Discover How God Sees You:

- Write out this verse and begin to memorize it. Meditate on this fact. Say it out loud as your declaration: "I have been lavished with the Father's great love." Do you believe that? Why or why not?
- What do the following verses say about God's love for you? Meditate on each one, asking God to reveal His truth to you today.

John 3:16 (CJB): "For God so loved the world that he gave his only and unique Son, so that everyone who trusts in him may have eternal life, instead of being utterly destroyed."

Romans 5:5, 8 (ESV): "Hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us. ... God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Romans 8:38 (NLT): "I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love."

- The Bible has so much to say about how much God loves you. I encourage you to read the entire New Testament to discover more. Have you experienced God's love like this? If not, why not? If so, what has that felt like? Ask God to reveal more of His great love for you.
- I just got back from a trip to California with my mom. Some ministry partners lavished their love on us—paying for our flights, putting us up in their five-star hotel, taking us to dinner, and so on. But this is just a small taste of how much the Father loves us.
- Throughout this book, we will look at God's love many times, from many angles. It has to be the foundation for understanding who we are and how God sees us.

A Prayer for You:

Father, thank You for lavishing me with Your love. Help me to understand Your love in new and fresh ways. Show me anything that is holding me back from experiencing Your full love for me.

January 5 I Am a Child of God

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has become a child of God. 1 John 5:1 NLT

Steps on Your Journey to Discover How God Sees You:

So many people are fatherless, whether their father has walked out of their life, has died or is abusive. What an encouragement knowing God is a father to the fatherless, whether you have a good earthly father or not (Psalm 68:5). What do the following verses add? John 1:12 (ESV): "To all who did receive him [Jesus], who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God."

Philippians 2:14-15 (NIV): "Do everything without grumbling or arguing, so that you may become blameless and pure, 'children of God without fault in a warped and crooked generation.' Then you will shine among them like stars in the sky."

1 John 3:1 (NIV): "See what great love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are! The reason the world does not know us is that it did not know him."

- Regardless of what your earthly father was like, Father God loved you so much He called you His child. Think about that. The Lord calls *you* His child. It doesn't matter who you are or what you have done; if you believe in Him and accept Him, He gives you the right to become His child (John 1:12).
- What does it mean to you to be God's child? Take some time to meditate on that today. This is a key issue for us to understand. Ask God to help you to see yourself as He sees you.
- Do you act like a child of the Living God? Do you act like you are loved? Or do you act like an unloved orphan? Is there anything you need to change in how you act?

A Prayer for You:

Father, thank You for making me Your child. Help me to experience Your love and feel like Your son/daughter. Show me anything that is holding me back from fully understanding what it means to be a child of God. Forgive me for the times I haven't acted like Your child, but have instead acted like an orphan. Teach me what Your children should act like.
