## What's in a Name? Foreword by Dick Eastman

We all agree—one's name is important!

A name, according to Webster's dictionary, is "a word or phrase that constitutes the distinctive designation of a person or thing." In our lives, the unique ability to give "distinctive designation" to people and things, through a name, helps us order our very existence. When we hear the name of a friend or loved one, we immediately conjure up images of that person and his or her characteristics.

One of the first jobs Adam was given in the garden was to name all the animals. From the beginning, God made humans with the ability to organize their life and identify things around them through naming. But often we forget just how important a name can actually be. Imagine using only generic terms when speaking to those around us? Hey, you! Or, hey person with the brown hair! Imagine shouting to a child in one's family: "Come here, short person with the freckles." Life would be sadly generic and sometimes even confusing. What if two of one's children were short and both had freckles?

The reality in life is that each of us was given a name by our parents, and this name is one of the primary means of preserving our identity in a world of seven billion-plus people. Names, in our western culture, often represent decades or sometimes centuries of family heritage. What comes to your mind when you hear the name Winston Churchill, Dwight David Eisenhower or Mother Theresa? Likewise, names often carry special meaning or ascribe particular attributes to us.

Names can represent societal trends and therefore identify someone with a specific era in history. In some unique instances in the Bible what a child was named was so important that angels would actually come to earth and tell expecting parents what to name their coming child. For example, an angel told Zachariah (see Luke chapter one) to name their son John. We would know him for generations to come as John the Baptist. Joseph, likewise, was told in a dream to name Mary's baby boy "Jesus," a name that literally means "God saves." Clearly, what we are called by those around us is significant. Names have always been a big deal to God.

Throughout time, God has been gracious enough to reveal His own name in multiple ways to humankind. Starting with Adam and progressing until today, in various times and in various ways, God has revealed His identity to people using phrases that one might view as His names. Today, we're more accustomed to hearing the various names attributed to our Lord. Can you imagine what it was like when the first prophet learned that our Lord was "the God of angel armies?" Undoubtedly there was a sense of awe and wonder. Even today, I am filled with that same awe and wonder when I hear many of the names of our Lord. What an amazing privilege that God has actually told us Who He is by revealing His vast variety of names in so many ways throughout His Word!

Over my years of following Jesus, I have found tremendous confidence and strength from regularly considering the names of the Lord in prayer. For decades I have compiled my own personal list of the Lord's names, drawing these names from numerous translations of Scripture. From these lists, I have written into each day's entry in my journal one of those names, claiming the fullness of that name for that specific day. Often I allow that name to become a song that I sing in my devotional time for that day.

As I meditate, speak, and pray the names of the Lord over the situations of my life, I have found that what I'm actually doing is inserting God's very identity into those situations. When I proclaim a biblical name of our Lord, I'm making a statement of faith—God is Who He said He

is! The knowledge of God's name literally transforms the way we live by infusing faith into our prayers! Of course, certain passages of Scripture fortify this reality. The Psalmist sang:

"Hallelujah! Thank God! Pray to him by name! Tell everyone you meet what he has done...Honor his holy name with Hallelujahs, you who seek God...Keep your eyes open for God, watch for his works" (Psalm 105:1, 3-4 The Message Bible).

On an earlier occasion the psalmist declared:

"All day we parade God's praise—we thank you by name over and over" (Psalm 44:8 The Message Bible).

All these thoughts lead me to highlight this wonderful collection of Names of our Lord that you hold in your hand. They have been compiled by a special friend of my wife and me, Gaylyn Williams. Like me, years ago Gaylyn began compiling descriptive phrases that define and describe our Lord. My list contains almost 700 such names, but Gaylyn's goes far beyond that. You will find literally hundreds and hundreds of such descriptive expressions in Scripture in the pages that follow. Indeed, the author of this helpful guide has saved you countless hours in searching out these cherished expressions describing the nature and character of our Lord.

My suggestion to you is this: Pray these names daily—and sing them, memorize them and (most of all) live them. You'll soon discover a personal Jesus that you've never known before. Further, you'll find practical ways to apply these names. A famous credit card commercial once saturated their advertising with the phrase—"Don't leave home without it!" May I suggest that you start each day with a fresh Name of our Lord from this list and that you "don't leave home without it!" Carry Christ's Name into your day! You will never regret it.

## Discovering Joy in Intimacy with God thoughts From the author

I began my adventure exploring God's names when my second son, Daniel, was three months old. After being in and out of the hospital— mostly in—his whole life, the doctor had just told me Daniel had six to twelve months left to live.

What had been a time of grief, sadness and questioning turned into a surprisingly joyful experience. After six surgeries and seeing twenty-five pediatric specialists, I finally realized the doctors couldn't do anything to save Daniel. God was his only hope.

The previous three months, I had focused on my problems and became more and more depressed. The day the doctor delivered my son's "death sentence," I knew I had a choice. I could be sad and miserable, or I could choose to focus on God and trust Him.

Daily I cared for my three-year-old son Jonathan, along with juggling Daniel's numerous doctor appointments and high levels of oxygen. During those difficult months, I started a list of God's names from the Word. Every day I chose to take time to focus on God, even though it was not easy.

Daniel's health slid downhill, until he went into a three-day coma when he was almost six months old. He woke up briefly just before he went to be with Jesus. At that moment, I experienced an unexpected joy, because I knew God had healed him—not as I hoped, but he was now completely whole and healthy.

I discovered that when I focus on my problems, they seem to get bigger and more overwhelming. However, when I focus on God, my problems seem to shrink compared to how great He is. And I experience amazing joy and peace.

That adventure started 25 years ago and I'm still on it, although I took a break for a few years. And guess what? During those years when I stopped focusing on God—because I was fixated on my problems—I experienced less peace and joy, as well as depression and hopelessness.

I now have over 1800 names of God from the Word and I'm still finding more. I'm constantly astonished at all of God's names. The more I study them, the more joy, peace and excitement God is giving me with life. Our God is so great. I'm sure no matter how much we learn about Him, we'll never know everything.

Studying God's names and getting to know Him better through them has been one of the greatest adventures of my life. I pray you too will be surprised by incredible joy and peace as you study His names and as you get to know Him better with all the various facets of Who He is.

## How to Use This Book

The purpose of this devotional is to reveal more of Who God is and empower you to experience a deeper intimacy with Him. It is not meant to be me sharing all my wisdom. It is designed to help you dig deeper to discover more about God for yourself and grow in your relationship with Him.

Each day has a Scripture, questions to ponder and a short prayer related to the name. You can use them as a springboard to a deeper prayer time and study. There is space to journal on most days; however, you might want to keep a separate journal beside you to add more. I briefly share some of my stories so you can see how God's names have affected my life. I share both victories and defeats in my adventure to know God better.

#### You Can Use This Book In The Following Ways:

- in your personal devotions, drawing you into deeper intimacy with God
- as a couples devotional, growing in your relationship with each other and God
- with your children, helping them gain a bigger view of God
- in a small group, sharing your insights together

If you don't yet have a personal relationship with God, you've come to the right place. You can explore more of who God is in a relaxed way. If you want to know more, go to page 369

In this book, I use different translations of the Bible, which show variations and nuances of God's names. You might want to check other translations to see how they depict our awesome God. The abbreviations for the Bible translations are on the copyright page. All unmarked verses are from the New International Version.

Throughout the book I encourage you to memorize Bible verses. When you have the Word in your heart, you'll be amazed at the times God will bring it back to you—just when you need it. I've been memorizing Scripture since I was a child. Often during the night, when I wake up and can't go back to sleep, I'll begin meditating on a verse.

I had a missionary friend, Chet Bitterman, who was captured by terrorists in Colombia in the 1980s. Although he had no Bible, he had the Word in his heart and mind. He had just finished memorizing the book of 1 Peter. His letters to his wife were filled with Scripture. If you were suddenly without your Bible, how much of it would you have in you? For help on memorizing verses, go to www.365NamesofGod.com.

At the back of the book are lists where you can find help for specific situations. For example, if you are feeling sad, you can go to page 22, where you can find comfort in God's name "My Exceeding Joy." If you need hope, go to page 13.

#### **Hebrew and Greek Words:**

I include many of God's names in the original languages. However, I am not a Hebrew or Greek scholar. I only include that information to add to your understanding. I don't pretend to fully comprehend them. I'm a fellow adventurer, longing to continue to know God more intimately.

About spelling: I write the Hebrew and Greek words so they are easy to pronounce (I'm sure there are other ways to spell them).

About pronouns: When a name of God starts with a pronoun, such as my or your, I only show the Hebrew root, not the pronoun. The pronoun is a suffix on the noun.

The Hebrew Word, Sh'ma, on the front cover is the first word in Deuteronomy 6:4, "Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one." It means hear, listen in order to obey the Name (God's Name.) The ancient Hebrew symbols in Sh'ma were a picture of an eye and a picture representing "name," meaning "See the Name." This book is all about seeing and hearing God's Name(s). Sh'ma is also written Shema or Shma.

# January 1 The Beginning and the End *Arkhay Kai Telos (Greek)*

I am the Alpha and the Omega, the First and the Last, the Beginning and the End. Revelation 22:13 (ESV)

### **Steps on Your Journey to Know God More Intimately:**

- Arkhay means beginning or principality. Telos means end, ending and finally.
- Happy New Year. Just think: this is a new year, an opportunity to begin fresh. As we end one year and begin a new one, it's a great time to focus on the Lord being the Beginning and the End.
- Think about this name. What does it mean to you?
- How does this name affect your life today? This year?
- How did last year begin, what was different at the end?
- As I begin this year, I choose to let go of the difficult things from this last year and begin fresh. I encourage you to do the same.
- Take some time today to reflect on all the good things God did in your life this last year. Thank Him for His blessings (even if things were not as positive as you would have liked.)
- Talk to the Lord about this coming year. What do you want to be different this year? Remember, He is the Beginning. He can bring you new beginnings.

### **A Prayer For You:**

Thank You, Lord, that You are the Beginning and the End. Thank You for all the great things You did in my life last year. I'm looking forward to seeing what You have for me this coming year. Thank You that I can start over fresh with You, the Beginning.

# January 2 Him Who Is from the Beginning **Ton Apo Arkhay (Greek)**

*I am writing to you, fathers, because you knowhim who is from the beginning.* 1 John 2:13 (ESV)

### **Steps on Your Journey to Know God More Intimately:**

- *Ton* means he, one, the and that. Apo means from, of and out of. *Arkhay* means beginning.
- Meditate on this name.2 What does it mean to you today that God is from the beginning?
- How does it affect your life knowing He has always been there?
- He has no beginning ... or end. If you're like me, it's hard to really comprehend that He has no beginning. Ask the Lord to reveal to you what that means.
- Spend some time praising the Lord using this name.

### **A Prayer For You:**

Lord, I praise You that You have always existed and You always will. Open my mind to be able to comprehend this truth that You are Him Who Is from the Beginning. Please show me what this name means to me personally.

## January 3

### God

### elohim (hebrew); Theos (Greek)

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Genesis 1:1 (NKJV)

### **Steps on Your Journey to Know God More Intimately:**

- Deuteronomy 10:17 says, "The Lord your God is God of gods, and Lord of lords. He is the great God, the mighty and awesome God, who shows no partiality and cannot be bribed" (NLT).
- This is the very first of God's names that He gives us, in the first verse of the Bible. These
  verses use Elohim, which means Almighty God, the Creator. It is also the word that is
  used of any god, not just the One True God. Elohim is plural of God, revealing the first
  hint of the Trinity, one God in three persons. Theos mean the supreme deity.
- Each word for God and gods is exactly the same word in the Old Testament verses above.
- Ephesians 2:4-5 says, "But because of his great love for us, God, who is rich in mercy, made us alive with Christ even when we were dead in transgressions—it is by grace you have been saved.
- I grew up in a little village high in the mountains of Guatemala, where my parents were missionaries with Wycliffe Bible Translators. I saw the Mayans worshipping all their gods, burning their incense and candles in front of the Catholic Church.
- Meditate on this name. Ask God to reveal more of Himself to you today.
- What does the name God mean to you?

### **A Prayer For You:**

God, I praise You that You are the God of gods and Lord of lords. Thank You that You are the mighty and awesome God, that You are the Creator. Please open my eyes, ears and heart to know You more and more intimately.

## January 4 My Faithful God

Into your hands I commit my spirit; deliver me, Lord, my faithful God. Psalm 31:5

### **Steps on Your Journey to Know God More Intimately:**

- When Jesus was hanging on the cross, He quoted part of this verse in Luke 23:46: "Jesus called out with a loud voice, 'Father, into your hands I commit my spirit."
- The Hebrew word for faithful is *emeth* and means certainty, truth, trustworthiness, establishment, faithful, right, sure and true. Some versions translate this name as "The God of Truth." *El* is the singular for *Elohim*.
- Merriam-Webster3 defines faithful as, "steadfast in affection or allegiance; firm in adherence to promises or in observance of duty; given with strong assurance; true to the facts, to a standard or to an original." Think about these definitions. What does it mean to you that God is your faithful God?
- I have seen God's faithfulness in my life so many times. One example is in how He has provided for all of my needs, sometimes in a miraculous way. As a young single mom, I was so poor that I was turned down for the indigent health care. Why? Because I didn't make enough money. That is a true story! However, even though many months I didn't have enough to pay my bills, yet I always paid them—from my own checkbook. I can't explain it, except for God's faithfulness. He is faithful to you too.
- Because He is faithful, we can depend on Him for anything and everything. Often we can't depend on people to remain faithful to us, but we can stake our lives on the fact that God won't ever change.

### A Prayer For You:

Thank You, My Faithful God, for always being faithful to me. I praise You that You are trustworthy, truthful and dependable. Teach me to trust You more and rely on You for every area of my life.

### **January 5**

### LORD

## yhwh or yahweh (hebrew)

Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you your heart's desires. Psalm 37:4 (NLT)

### **Steps on Your Journey to Know God More Intimately:**

- This is the Hebrew word, *YHWH*, Yahweh or Jehovah. It means the Self-Existent One, the Covenant-Keeping God, the Unchangeable and Intimate God. In many English versions, it is written with small capital letters. We'll look at the name "Lord" (with lower case letters) later.
- Proverbs 3:5-6: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take" (NLT).
- This was such a sacred name of God, that the Israelites would not even say it. Yet often people in our culture use God's name in vain.
- Ask the Lord to show you if you need to change anything you say. If you have misused His name, ask for His forgiveness and decide that you will no longer do it. I'm so glad our God is a forgiving God. Aren't you?
- This name is used thousands of times in the Old Testament. Meditate on it today, asking the Lord to reveal more of Himself through it.

### A Prayer For You:

Thank You, Lord, that You are a personal, intimate God, even though You are holy. Thank You for being trustworthy, because You are a covenant-keeping God. Help me to learn to trust You and delight in You more and more.
