Introduction

I'm excited you're joining me on my adventure to know God deeper. When I began this journey, I had no idea where it would take me.

My world had just turned upside-down when I began my journey to know God better. I was thirteen years old and I had spent the previous eleven years in Guatemala. We were a missionary family, and had just moved to Southern California.

I was catapulted from my sheltered environment at home and my boarding school with about thirty students to a high school with almost four thousand. Plus, I was younger than most of them.

I didn't know how to do anything in this "foreign" culture, which should have been familiar to me. After all, it was my home culture. I was used to being a foreigner in Guatemala, but never expected to feel like an outsider in my own country. I didn't know how to do anything right—talk, dress, walk, fix my hair or put on makeup. Although naturally an introvert, I became so shy I wouldn't even talk to my best friend in public!

At first I looked at all the things I was deprived of because of my sheltered life, including stylish clothes and hair styles, television (we didn't have one in Guatemala), and freedom (without my parents fearing I could be abducted by guerrillas!).

Quickly I realized what the "world" didn't offer what I wanted. I began to ravenously study the Word on my own, as well as attending church services and Bible studies. The only time my parents ever put me on "restriction" was when they told me that until I could drive, I

was only allowed to go to church five nights a week! (Parents of teens, don't you wish you had that problem!)

This began my passion to know the Lord better.

I was raised knowing God and learning about Him from my parents and at Huehue, the boarding school I attended from age six to thirteen. At Huehue we were required to have personal devotions every day, go to chapel and memorize verses every week. By the time I was in eighth grade, we had to memorize eighteen to twenty verses every week, word perfect, with only two prompts!

I did those things because they were required of me, not because I wanted to do them. That all changed when I moved to California. Once I had choices I realized I longed to know God better..

Fast forward through high school, college, my wedding, years as a missionary, writing books and raising my son Jonathan. When I found out my son Daniel, who was born with multiple problems, was dying, I began to study God's names. I found incredible strength as I focused on our amazing God. You can read more of that story in *Keys to Joy*, a Bible study my dad and I wrote. During Daniel's short life, less than six months, I learned to focus on God rather than the situation. Although I must admit, during this first three months, I focused on my problems and felt overwhelmed. When I looked to God, I experienced so much peace and joy in the midst of the pain.

During Daniel's short life and the months following his death, I discovered about two hundred of God's names. I began meditating on each one. The Lord brought me through that painful time as I focused on who He is: His greatness, power, love, and multifaceted nature.

I set my list of God's names aside for about twenty years as I raised my sons (Timothy was born two years after Daniel died), wrote more books, started businesses and a ministry, and ended up a single mom of two rambunctious boys. Then a few years ago, I began to passionately ask God to reveal more of Himself to me. And He did. Without specifically searching for His names, He began to point them out, one by one, as I read and studied His Word.

I compiled over 2500 names of God from the Bible and I'm convinced my journey has just begun! I decided to use only 2031 names, because the theme verse for this book is John 20:31: "These are written so that

you may believe, that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you might have life in His name.”

What is a name? It represents all that a person is and does: his looks, characteristics, attributes, attitudes, actions and much more. We can get to know Him in new ways through each of His names.

Think about how many names you have. They could be your first name, your last name, your full name, Mom (or Dad), Honey (or Sweetheart or something else), Sister (or Brother), friend, etc. Count up how many different names you have. Now consider how many names God has used for Himself. Each name tells us something about Him. I don't know about you, but I'm totally amazed by all of God's names!

God often refers to Himself in the Bible as “The Name of the Lord,” “The Name” or many variations of those. He is referring to all He is, not to only one characteristic. At the top of each page in the main part of this book, you will find a verse about the “Name” of the Lord.

Things you might want to know:

- Some of the names are in numerous verses. I picked a few to share with you.
- Some are very similar to each other. I've included many (and omitted a number of them) so that you can see the slight variations of His character.
- Many of the exact same names appear in several translations. I just chose one translation for each.
- Some of the verses that are written at the tops of the pages are excerpts, not the full verses. Also, sometimes I put extra information from the verse's context in parentheses. Usually it reveals the speaker or the context.
- Some names have several parts to them. I chose to divide them so we can focus on the specific parts. For example Hebrews 7:26 says, “Such a high priest meets our need – one who is holy, blameless, pure, set apart from sinners, exalted above the heavens.” I divided the names as follows:

One Who Is Holy, Blameless and Pure

One Who Is Set Apart from Sinners

One Who Is Exalted above the Heavens

Greek and Hebrew Names

I include over 400 of God's names in the original languages—Greek, Hebrew and Aramaic. However, I am not a Hebrew or Greek scholar. I include that information to add to your understanding. I'm a fellow adventurer, longing to continue to know God more intimately. As I have studied the original languages, I've been so blessed.

When a name of God in the Old Testament starts with a pronoun, such as my, our or your, I usually only show the Hebrew root, not the pronoun, which is a suffix on the noun.

I have written the original languages so you can easily pronounce them. There are various ways to write most of them. If I had written them in their correct fonts, most people would not have been able to read them. Sometimes I write the same name in more than one way to show the various ways it can be pronounced.

Two names in the Old Testament translated Lord:

- *Adonai*, which is usually written in lower case, "Lord." *Adonai* means Master, Owner or Provider.
- *YHWH*, *Jehovah*, *Yehovah*, or *Yahweh* is usually written as LORD (with small caps). These are different ways to write and speak the same name. It is God's holy name. It means the Self-Existent One, the Covenant-Keeping God, the Unchangeable One, and the Intimate God.

Some translations use *Adonai* for both of the names, because some people don't want to say God's holy name. The *Orthodox Jewish Bible* translates this name as "Hashem," which means, "The Name," so they don't say God's holy name.

I include some of the names in Hebrew from the *Orthodox Jewish Bible* (OJB). They are sometimes a combination of Hebrew and English. Even though the New Testament was written in Greek, the OJB uses Hebrew names.

- Enhance your intimacy with God as you explore His names
- Experience the fullness of your awesome God through His names revealed in his Word
- Come into God's presence in new ways
- Discover comfort, strength and hope from God's character
- Expand your vision for God's power, majesty and greatness
- Enjoy a growing passion for God through praise and worship
- Transform your prayer life and strengthen your faith

This book can transform your life, if you choose to study God's names and mediate on them daily. Ask God to show you how to get the most from this book. If you're not sure, you are welcome to email me directly.

- Individuals wanting to know God more intimately
- Couples longing to deepen their intimacy with God and each other
- Families can help their children gain a larger view of God at an early age

- You can go straight through the book, reading and meditating on each name. Or you can jump around, asking the Lord to show you where He wants you to start.
- Look up each Scripture reference. Note: if you look it up in a different translation than what is listed, the name may be different, or it may be written as a description, rather than a name of God.
- Meditate on one or more names each day. You might want to write down your insights about the names in a separate notebook.
- Whether you are studying this book alone or with others, meditate on one or more names each day, writing down your insights about them. If you are studying with others, have each person meditate on names on specific pages and then share together what God is showing you. The Appendix has suggestions for studying with a group.
- Highlight the names that stand out to you. You might want to write notes next to some or all of them.

I pray that this book helps you view God in new ways so your faith will be bolstered and you you will experience His life-giving power as you get to know Him more intimately. May you experience His love and joy in greater ways than you have never known.

Leader's Guide for Small Groups

You can use these suggestions for any small groups, including with your spouse and/or children.

Leading a group discussion is a rewarding experience. It can also be frightening, especially if it's your first time. By giving specific suggestions, this guide will help facilitate group discussion. As you prepare and lead the group, remember 2 Corinthians 12:9: "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Accept His grace and power to lead your group.

Here are some ideas that may help you:

1. Pray that God will give wisdom and guidance as you study to learn everything He wants to teach you personally, as well as to effectively lead the discussion. Also pray for God to give all group members understanding and excitement as they study.
2. Start and end on time. Begin each class with prayer.
3. Before each session, choose between one and ten pages to study. You might want to discuss with your group how many pages they want to study for the week.
4. Have each person look up study and meditate on the truths on the pages you will study. It is more important to go deeper in the study than to get through more truths. Each person should use a separate notebook to write down what the Lord is showing them through each truth about how God sees them.
5. In the first session, as well as whenever anyone new begins the class, tell everyone that everything shared in the study is completely confidential. Get an agreement from participants that they will not share outside the group, anything they hear in the group-

including talking to each other about another member, when they are not present.

6. Encourage each member to participate but be sensitive to the shy ones. Never call on anyone who has not volunteered to share. Wait until they are ready to talk, otherwise the group may feel unsafe to those who are more introverted.
7. During the session, ask the following questions and allow the group to discuss each one:
 - a. Which truths of how God sees you stood out to you and why?
 - b. Which verses ministered to you and why?
 - c. What is the Lord teaching you as you get to know how He sees you?
8. End each class with a time of prayer, giving participants an opportunity to share with God whatever is on their heart.
9. In the first session, if the group members don't know each other, have everyone briefly introduce themselves. Keep it short so you have time for the Bible Study.

Enjoy your study. As you share with your group, you will learn even more than you would on your own.

Discovering a Personal Relationship with God

If you don't yet have a personal relationship with God, congratulations on taking a giant step in your search. I've had a relationship with God for many years. It has been the most exciting adventure of my life – and I have traveled all over the world and had some amazing adventures. I encourage you to get to know Him. It is well worth it.

Consider the following:

Romans 3:23 explains that we “all have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God.” We can't have a relationship with God on our own.

Romans 6:23 tells us that as a result of sin in our lives there is price to be paid – death. But instead of death, God wants to give us a gift – “eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.” He trades our sins for the gift of getting to live with Him forever. I say that's a very good trade for us!

John 3:16 sheds light on how much God loves us, how desperately He wants to give us this gift of living with Him forever. We see the sacrifice He made so He could give us this gift. “For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.”

Romans 10:9 explains there are two simple things you and I need to do in order to receive this gift: “If you confess with your mouth, ‘Jesus is Lord,’ and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved.” Confess just means to speak out that Jesus is Lord.

Do these truths resonate with you? If you haven't yet trusted Jesus as your Savior, you can do so right now, by praying a prayer like the following (you can use whatever words you want):

Dear Lord, I realize I'm a sinner and need You. Thank You for dying on the cross for my sins and rising again the third day from the dead. I now confess all my sins and repent. I ask You to forgive me and cleanse me from all sin. Thank You for saving me and making me right with You. In Jesus' name. Amen.

Look what happens in Heaven the moment we put our trust in Jesus. Luke 15:7 says, "I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent." How do you respond to that?

There's no pressure to trust God immediately. He's not in a hurry, although He would love to talk with you anytime.

If you just trusted Jesus as your Savior, congratulations.

Now I encourage you to do some things:

- Get a modern Bible at a Christian bookstore (if you don't already have one) so you can read God's love-letters to you in familiar, contemporary language. As you read, you'll gain wonderful insights into who God is and the wonderful plans He has for you. A good place to start reading is in the book of John.
- Find a Bible-believing church where you can learn and grow.
